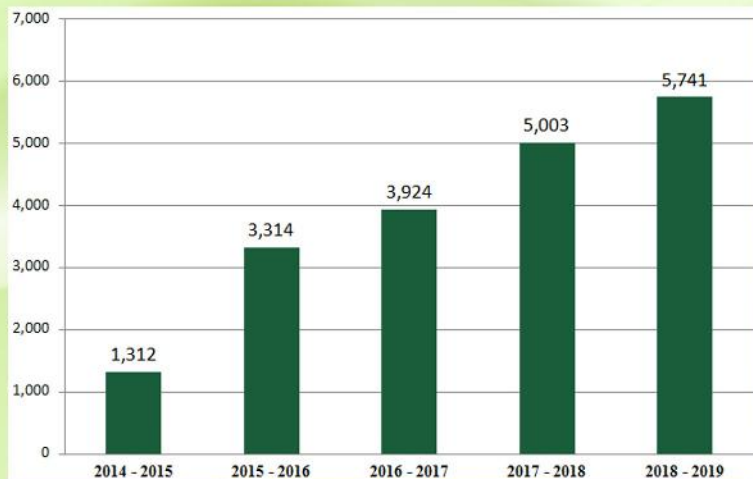
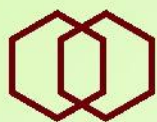


ORGANIZATION OF LY TU TRONG COLLEGE OF HO CHI MINH CITY

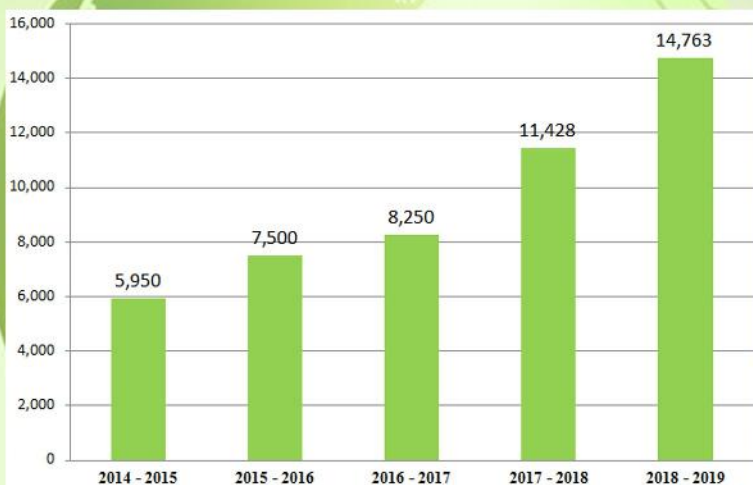

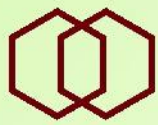

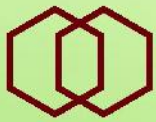

International of Training is the primary concern of the school to seek partners in the region and world to access advanced training and integrate into the international labor market.

- Organize workshops, career counseling for students.
- Search for scholarship programs for students and staff.
- Implement cultural exchange programs with foreign universities and colleges.
- Actively develop international cooperation with foreign institutions: Kunsan National University, Koje College Korean, Cardiff Metropolitan University, United Kingdom.

On international cooperation projects, in 2015-16 and 2016-17 school year, the school successfully built two non-refundable non-governmental aid projects, approved by Ho Chi Minh City People's Committee worth a total of VND 24,8 billion.

Schneider Electric Foundation, France with the support of DEG - a subsidiary of the German Development Bank and ASSIST, a non-governmental international capacity building organization opened the "Green Electrician" lab worth a total of VND 9,8 billion.

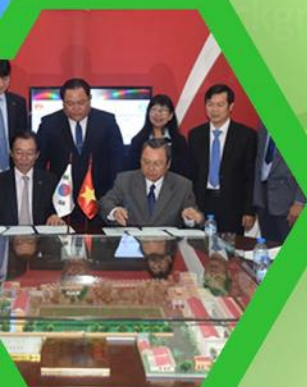

ASSOCIATE VICE PROVOST , VIET NAM/ SE ASIA OF ASU

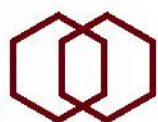

CHIEF VISION OFFICER, ELECTUDE

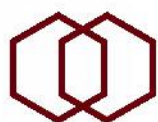

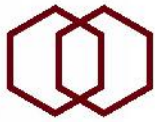
FELICITAS HUONG FRIEDRICH

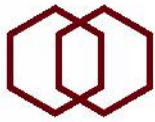

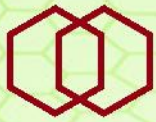


SUSAN D'ALOIA

PROJECT “GREEN ELECTRICIAN”

- Sustainable energy management and business.
- Target youths to help them reach the opportunities for stable employment.
- The desire to create opportunities for at least 500 learners to practice with modern equipment every year.

Training project “Green Electrician” with the support of Schneider Electric Foundation, France, DEG and a non-governmental international ASSIST ASIA sponsored training electric. The project was approved by decision number 4959/QĐ-UBND, September 22, 2016 of Ho Chi Minh City People’s Committee.

After the inauguration of the practice room, more than 150 learners trained and specialized training for nearly 1500 students of Faculty of Electrical-Electronics Technology. After the course, the project will issue a global certificate and a vocational certificate. In addition to the tuition fee for students with difficulty who have household registration in the province, the project also offers scholarships worth 300 USD and accommodation during the study period.

At present, the school is implementing its final year of the project with training courses to improve the capacity of lecturers of Faculty of Electrical-Electronics Engineering with modern teaching technology and teaching equipment of European standard. The teachers who have completed the solar installation projects led by German experts will be able to train teachers and other educational institutions. The school aims to build the ecosystem with entrepreneurial start-up activities for learners through start-up training courses for students participating in the program as well as students in the field of automation and sustainable energy to improve the quality of training for the smart industry in the context of industrial revolution 4.0

- Project "Promote Technical Education Reform of Mechanics and Electricification of Professional Technicians - PROMT" in the field of Elevator and Escalator.

Project PROMT by KONE Vietnam belongs to KONE Foundation Finland sponsored to build a training center for technicians in the field of elevators and escalators, provide training equipment and intelligent control solutions and modern. The project was approved by decision number 2225/QĐ-UBND, May 9th, 2017 of Ho Chi Minh City People's Committee.

It backed by Educational and Training Department, The Vietnam Union of Friendship Organizations and other Departments of the city and Ho Chi Minh City People's Committee, KONE Academic Training Center inaugurated on June 29th, 2018 with the participation of many distinguished guests, training experts from Finland, Singapore, Ambassador of Finland. The center is currently training and fostering for five lecturers at school and five others at Vocational Education Institutions.

Learners have trained in modern practice rooms of international standard, advanced teaching methods with 4.0 technology, virtual reality and online training system with the guidance of learning experts of KONE have over 30 years of experiences in the field of elevator and escalator.
