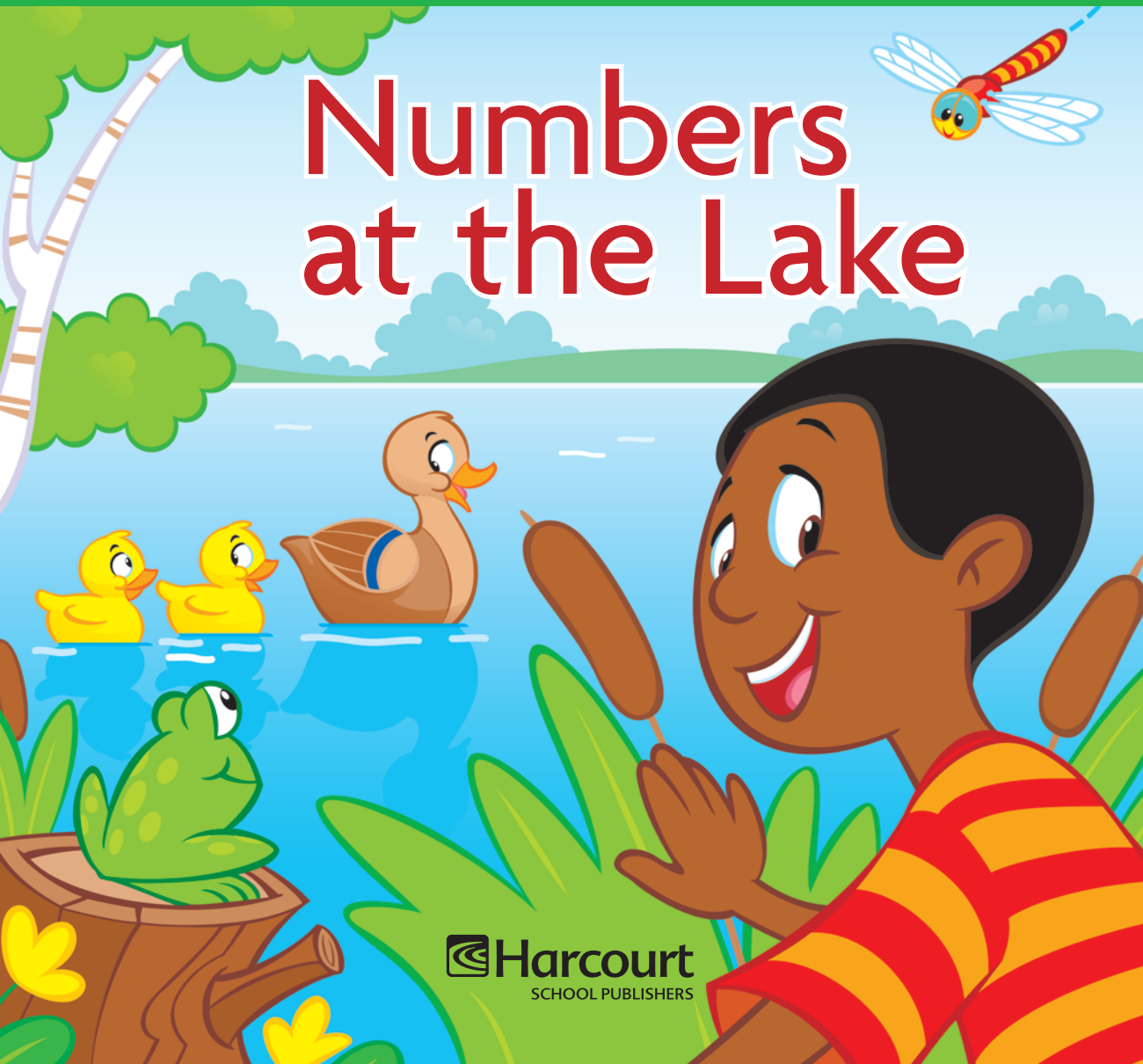

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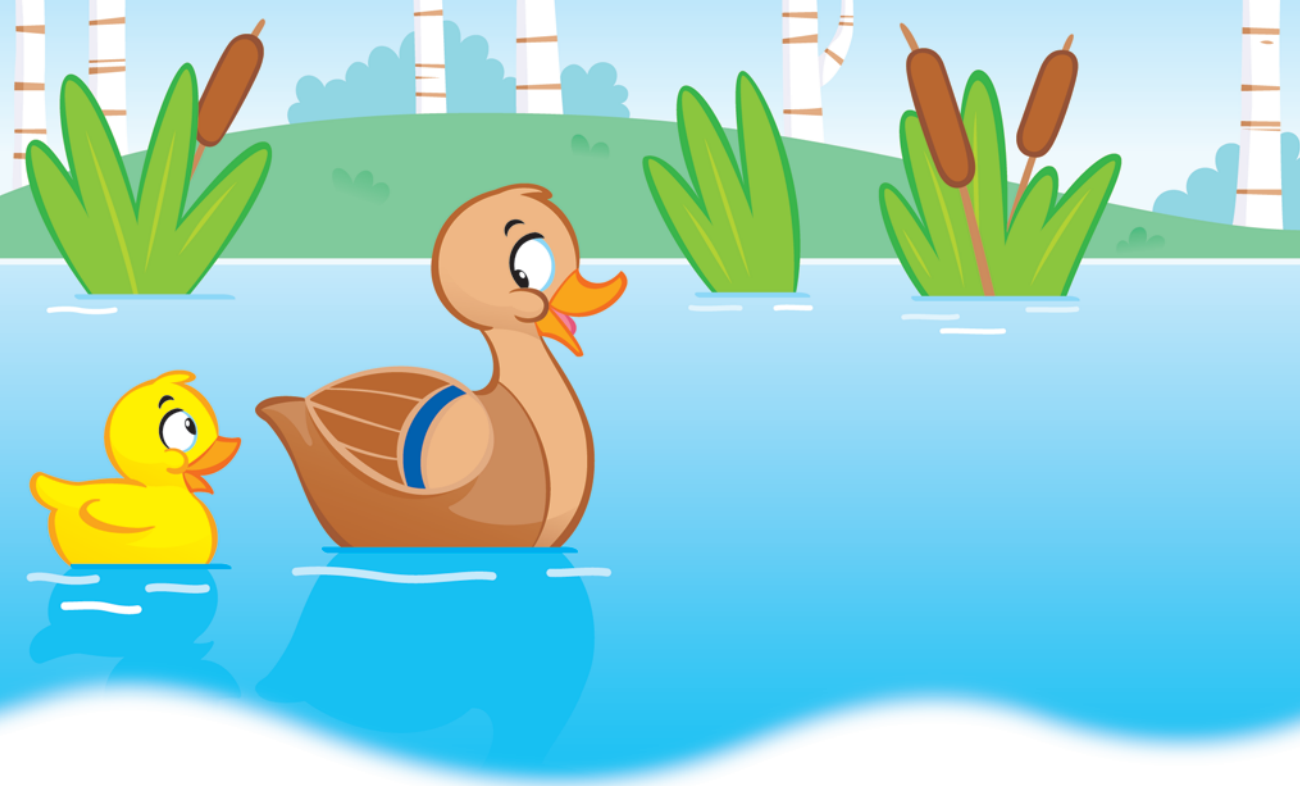

It is a warm, sunny day.

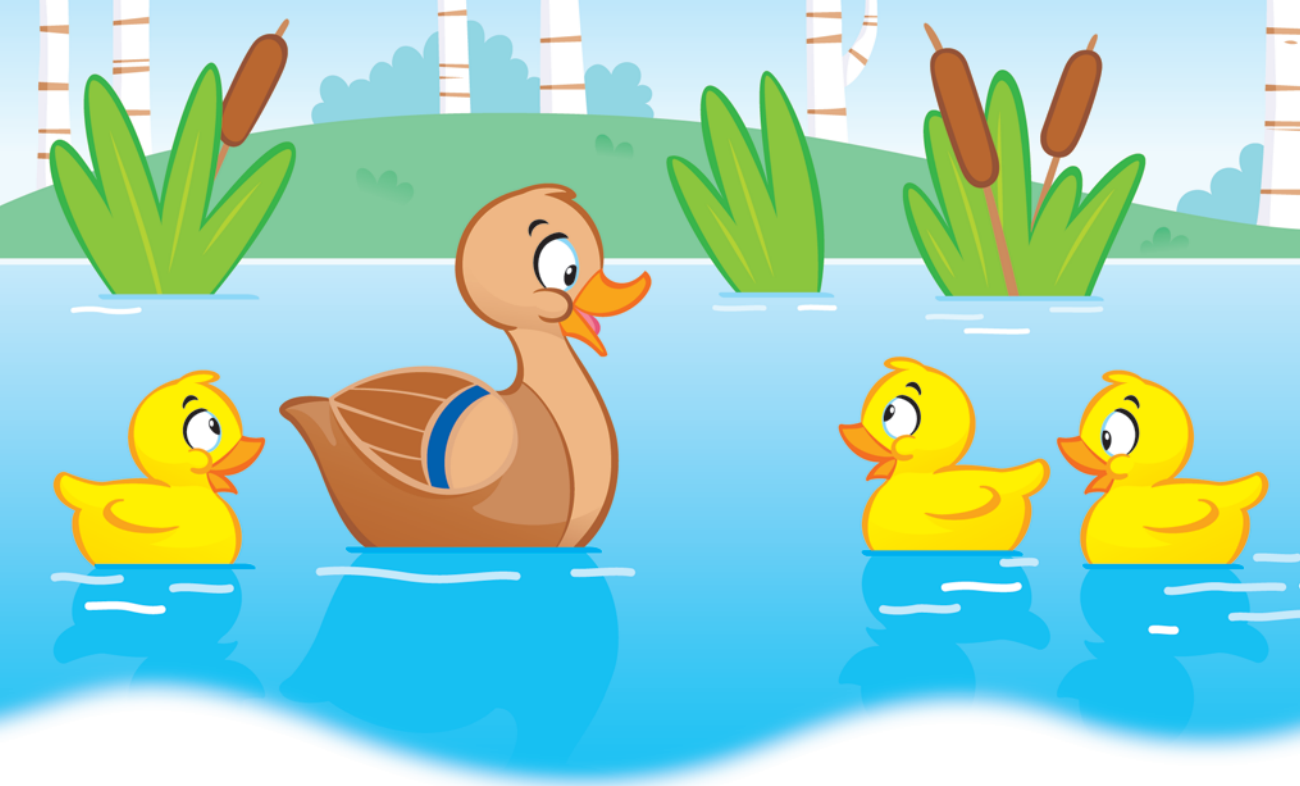


I see many animals at the lake.
They are in and around the water.



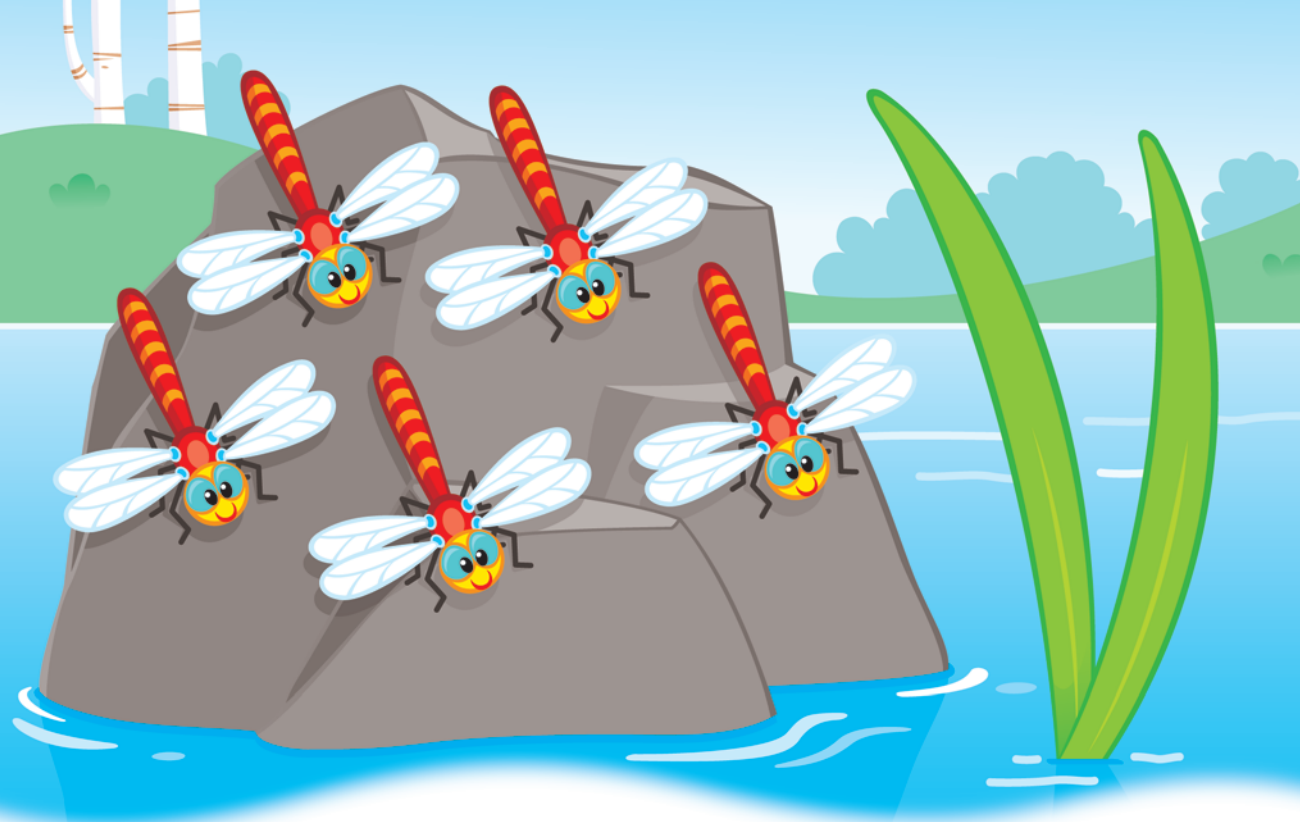
2

$$2 + 7 = 9$$

I see 2 more birds.

Now 9 birds soar over the water.

I see 6 frogs sitting on a curved log.



$$6 - 1 = 5$$

I frog hops away. Now 5 frogs sit
on the curved log. I like the lake!
